Electives 7 courses - 21 credits

Choose seven History courses. Incoming students as of fall 2026, will need to take a TOTAL of 3 upper level courses, 1 in each of our areas of concentration: US, Latin America, and World (defined as any other part of the world outside of the Americas.
